## Amended October 2021

1. The League to be known as the Jubilee League and played in Whites.
2. The Competition to be for Ladies Bowling Clubs in the North-West area of Kent and to be restricted to a maximum of twelve clubs (since amended to 14 clubs)
3. League Matches to be played under Bowls England Rules.
4. The committee of Management shall comprise one representative nominated by each of the Clubs in the League. The committee shall meet from time to time to manage the affairs of the league.
5. The Committee shall, each year appoint from their members, a Secretary/Treasurer
6. The Competition shall be a two triples game of 18 ends with 2 Trial Ends. Clubs playing each other at Home one year and Away the following year. The Home team will be responsible for forwarding the score result to the Secretary.
7. There is no objection to Clubs playing additional rinks in their inter-club matches, providing that the two rinks to count are nominated in advance.
8. 2 points shall be awarded to each winning rink, 1 point each to a tied rink, 2 points for winning the game. A club winning both triples will receive a maximum of 6 points. A club winning overall, but only because of a high score on one winning triple, will receive 4 points and the losing team 2 points for its' one winning triple. (Please see rule 10 for adjustments)
9. In the event of bad weather, a minimum of 22 ends (in total) will have to be played by the two triples in order that the score shall count. This must be agreed before the start of the match by both skips. If the match is cancelled because of bad weather, or in the event of the minimum number of ends not being played, points will be shared $3 / 3$. However, a weather cancelled match may always be re-arranged by mutual agreement.
10. If a club is unable to field a triples team to fulfil the fixture the game may be re-arranged at a later date but if this alternative cannot be agreed the defaulting team loses 3 points and the side being given the game only receives three points. No match to be played consisting of a pair and a triple on the team. (No $25 \%$ rule to be applied.) Should a player be taken ill or injured during the match the triple can use a reserve to play lead or no. 2 if one is available, failing this the triple will end their game and the score will count. The other triple will carry on until the end of the match.
11. In the event of two or more clubs sharing the lead in points at the end of the season, the club with the best shots for and against average will be declared the winner
12. A League match may be re-arranged in the event of the Club's green being required by BOWLS ENGLAND or K.C.B.A.
13. A Trophy will be presented to the winning club to be held until the following Annual General Meeting.
14. The Secretary to prepare an Annual Account of Expenditure for presentation to the committee
15. A bowler cannot play in League matches for more than one affiliated Club in any one season.
16. Any other matters or disagreements not covered by these rules, shall be dealt with by a subcommittee, comprising the Secretary and two other members from non-involved Clubs. Their decision will be final.
